This Weekend Is Pledge Weekend!

Our *Reclaiming Christ's Mission Together* campaign Pledge Weekend takes place this weekend here at St. Augustine. Please consider your pledge to the campaign today. Why is Pledging Vital?

Your pledge is a statement of your intent to give to the best of your ability. Bishop Barber and Fr. Augustine know that when you make your pledge, you will do your best to fulfill it. A 10% down payment is encouraged **but not necessary.**



Dear Brothers and Sisters - I wanted to inform you that our school tenant, EBI (Escuela Bilingue Internacional) will be doing many improvements to the interior and exterior of the school building this summer. EBI has been a wonderful tenant and partner for almost 10 years. We are lucky to have such a good steward with whom to share our St. Augustine campus.

I wanted to make you aware of some of these changes, so we all understand why additional activity and extra equipment may be on site for several months this summer. Specifically EBI will do repairs and upgrades to the windows, which will directly improve the look of the school. They will paint some of the exterior as well, and possibly rearranging some of their outdoor features.

Inside, EBI plans to upgrade bathrooms and classrooms and homogenize decades of paint colors. With an old building, one can expect lead. EBI has informed me that they will be working with certified contractors and following all federal guidelines when in contact with any lead paint. They are taking this particular aspect of the renovations very seriously, and I trust they will be in compliance.
